This PDF is for the **GRIDDLE STITCH**.

The Griddle Stitch Crochet Stitch is alternating single crochets and double crochets, and then you work doubles over single and singles over doubles. This stitch creates a wonderfully dense fabric without becoming rigid. It's suitable for color work and loads of different projects.

These instructions cover how to make the Griddle Stitch or Infinity Griddle Stitch. This doesn't include the Granny Rectangle or other variations of this stitch.

HOW TO Griddle Stitch Crochet

ABBREVIATIONS

U.S TERMS

CH - Chain

SK - Skip

SC - Single Crochet

YO - Yarn Over

REP - Repeat

DC - Double Crochet

Single Crochet (SC) - Insert your hook, YO pull up a loop, YO and pull through 2 loops.

Double Crochet (DC) - YO, Insert your hook, YO pull up a loop, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, pull through remaining two loops.

GRIDDLE CROCHET STITCH

MULTIPLE: ODD

ROW 1

Starting in the 2nd chain from hook, *work 1 SC. In the next stitch, work 1 DC. Repeat from * across the row. The last stitch made will be a DC. CH 1. Turn

ROW 2

Starting in the first stitch, *work 1 SC into the top of the DC of the previous row. 1 DC into the top of the next SC. Repeat from * across the row. The last stitch will be a DC. (Always DC into SC. Always SC into DC.) CH 1 and turn.

REPEAT ROW 2

Gauge Info

WHAT IS GAUGE?

Gauge is the number of stitches and rows in each inch. Gauge swatches are generally 4" x 4", unless you're working in rounds. We, at Ruby Grace strongly recommend you work a bigger swatch for a more accurate stitch count. This keeps you away from starting chains, and sides where the gauge can become skewed.

IS GAUGE IMPORTANT?

It's up for debate on whether you should and how accurate it really needs to be. We say yes to both! In fact our stitch gauges can get pretty technical. *Especially with garments!* It's not just hook sizes that matter either. Even the same category weight yarns can have different gauges.

Here's we look for on a **Griddle Stitch**:

#1

When looking at the height of a stitch we look at the actual height. The stitch is measured from the actual top of the stitch to the actual bottom. For this stitch, the double crochet is the most important to measure because it takes up more space. ***Note** - Stitches in this graphic are exaggerated. Single crochets will be considerably shorter than doubles in real life.

#2




To count width, keep in mind this stitch is made up of two stitches total. Since the single and double crochets will make up the majority of the body, be sure to place your ruler at the beginning of the 2 stitch repeat.

#3

This stitch can be tricky for counting rows. Look for the double crochets and count diagonally.


WHAT'S IN AN INCH?

Take your total rounds in 4" and divide it by 4. This will give you the amount of rounds per inch.
